

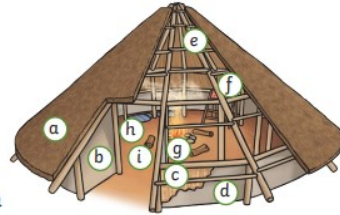

1	Iron Age	The Iron Age is the final epoch of the three-age division of the prehistory of humanity.
2	Hill fort	A fort built on a hill enclosed by a system of defensive banks and ditches.
3	Ramparts	A defensive wall of a castle or walled city, having a broad top with a walkway and typically a stone parapet.
4	Archaeologists	A person who studies human history and prehistory through the excavation of sites and the analysis of artefacts and other physical remains.
5	Roundhouse	A roundhouse is a type of house with a circular plan, usually with a conical roof.
6	Ditches	A narrow channel dug at the side of a road or field, to hold or carry away water.
7	Population	All the inhabitants of a particular place.
8	Ploughing	Turn up the earth of (an area of land) with a plough, especially before sowing.
9	Celts	The Celts were the most powerful people in central and northern Europe.
10	Decomposed	(with reference to a dead body or other organic matter) make or become rotten; decay or cause to decay.
