Lavender loves to be in a sunny, sheltered position and by cutting it back after it has finished flowering you will get lots of new bushy growth for next summer's moths and butterflies.



Butterfly and Moth Nectar Plants

Honeysuckle Moths, in particular, will love honeysuckle as it releases its lovely smell at night.

Catmint is easy to grow and has lovely blue flowers from early summer. It likes to grow in full sun or slightly shady areas. This plant may attract some feline friends too!

Thyme is great for providing nectar in mid summer. It smells lovely and can be used in cooking. Clipping it after it has flowered will keep the growth nice and dense.

The pretty blue flowers of Forget-me-nots will appear early in the spring. They will grow in full sun or partly shaded areas.

Marjoram is easy to grow and will flower from **July** all the way through the **summer**. It's a lovely herb for cooking with too.

Plant flowers that bloom at different times and there will be nectar available from early spring all the way through to autumn.
