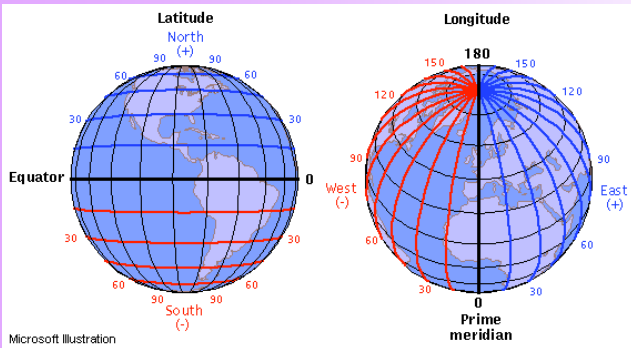
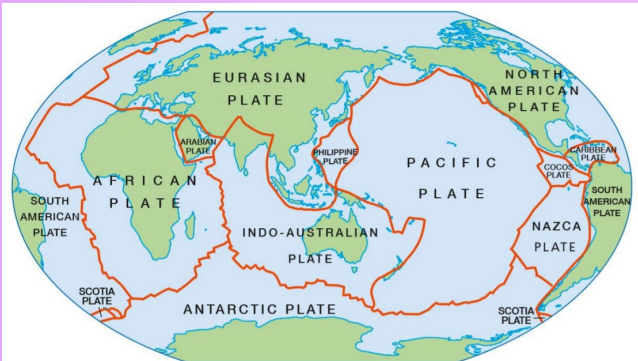

General Vocabulary

1	Latitude	The angular distance of a place north or south of the earth's equator.
2	Longitude	The angular distance of a place east or west of the Greenwich meridian
3	Equator	The line dividing the earth into northern and southern hemispheres
4	Hemisphere	A half of the earth, usually as divided into northern and southern
5	Climate	The weather conditions prevailing in an area in general or over a long period.

Specific Vocabulary

1	Volcano	A mountain or hill, typically conical, having a crater or vent.
2	Island	A piece of land surrounded by water.
3	Fjord	A long, narrow, deep inlet of the sea between high cliffs.
4	Magma	Hot fluid or semi-fluid material below or within the earth's crust.
5	Lava	Hot molten or semi-fluid rock erupted from a volcano.
6	Gulf Stream	A warm and swift Atlantic ocean current that originates in the Gulf of Mexico and stretches to the tip of Florida.
7	Glacier	A slowly moving mass or river of ice.
8	Archipelago	An extensive group of islands.
9	Geyser	A hot spring in which water intermittently boils, sending a tall column of water and steam into the air.
10	Geothermal	Relating to or produced by the internal heat of
11	Pacific ring of crust	A path along the Pacific Ocean characterized by active volcanoes
12	Tectonic Plate	A massive, irregularly shaped slab of solid rock.
